The Tennessee Afterschool network supports children, youth and families by building access to healthy and nurturing afterschool and summer learning experiences. Out-of-school-time programs give parents peace of mind, allow them to work a full schedule, and help them be more productive on the job and successful in their careers, including our essential workers. They also offer social and emotional support and enriching activities that spark kids' interest in school and learning.

Research shows that students participating in high-quality afterschool programs are less likely to abuse drugs or alcohol; are more likely to advance to the next grade and graduate from high school; earn higher grades and do better on standardized tests. Some out-of-school-time programs even provide opportunities for youth to gain employability skills, connect with local businesses, and explore possible careers.

Every year, 103 million Americans leave \$80 billion in public benefits unclaimed. United Way is committed to ensuring that struggling families in our state are aware of the benefits for which they qualify and know how to apply for them. In response, we are launched Tennessee Benefit Kitchen, a free screener that all Tennesseans can use to determine eligibility for several tax credits and many federal, state, and local public benefits—and to access the application sites to apply for those for which they qualify.

Tennessee residents simply text “Benefits” to 211-211, and they receive a screener that takes about 5 minutes to complete. Once completed, they immediately receive notice of tax credits and benefits for which they are eligible, along with the links to apply to each benefit.

**The tax credits and benefits covered in the screener currently include:**

- Food Stamps (SNAP)
- Cash Assistance (TANF)
- Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP)
- Women Infants and Children (WIC)
- Head Start
- School Meals
- Child Care Assistance
- TennCare (Medicaid, for adults and children)
- ACA (Affordable Care Act for adults and children)
- CHIP (Children's Health Insurance Program)
- County Medical Services
- Home Energy Assistance (HEAP)
- Lifeline
- Child Tax Credit
- Childcare Tax Credit
- Earned Income Tax Credit

In our first year of operation, more than 1600 Tennesseans received screenings that identified \$7.4 million in benefits!

### Bridget: 7 years old - Diagnosed with Osteosarcoma

St. Jude Children's Research Hospital opened on February 4, 1962, in Memphis, Tenn. They are leading the way the world understands, treats and defeats childhood cancer and other life-threatening diseases. "I thank God every day that she got kicked at soccer practice, because had she not, I don't know when we would have found the cancer," said Bridget's mom, Jamie. But what turned out to be a fortunate mishap still did not come in time to save Bridget's foot. Doctors at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital® determined that the bone cancer in her right tibia, osteosarcoma, had crossed the growth plate, and an amputation would be necessary for her treatment. Before the amputation, St. Jude Child Life Specialists came to Bridget's room to help her make keepsakes: casting a mold of her foot, making impressions of her toes. Bridget is also receiving chemotherapy. The name Bridget means "strength," and her mom feels a bittersweet pride at how her daughter has managed to adapt to treatment. Bridget is an athletic young girl who enjoys riding bikes and being outside and loves her big brother more than anything. "She's going to get back to all of those things, and it's because of the doctors and the treatment and the care that she is getting at St. Jude," said Jamie.
